#### **SCRIPTURE READING: Romans 8:18-25**

<sup>18</sup>I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worth comparing with the glory about to be revealed to us. <sup>19</sup>For the creation waits with eager longing for the revealing of the children of God; <sup>20</sup>for the creation was subjected to futility, not of its own will but by the will of the one who subjected it, in hope <sup>21</sup>that the creation itself will be set free from its bondage to decay and will obtain the freedom of the glory of the children of God. <sup>22</sup>We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labor pains until now; <sup>23</sup>and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. <sup>24</sup>For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? <sup>25</sup>But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

#### **GOSPEL READING: Luke 1:67-79**

<sup>67</sup>Then his father Zechariah was filled with the Holy Spirit and spoke this prophecy:

<sup>68</sup>"Blessed be the Lord God of Israel,

for he has looked favorably on his people and redeemed them.

<sup>69</sup>He has raised up a mighty savior for us in the house of his servant David,

<sup>70</sup>as he spoke through the mouth of his holy prophets from of old,

 $^{71}$ that we would be saved from our enemies and from the hand of all who hate us.

<sup>72</sup>Thus he has shown the mercy promised to our ancestors,

and has remembered his holy covenant,

<sup>73</sup>the oath that he swore to our ancestor Abraham,



to grant us <sup>74</sup>that we, being rescued from the hands of our enemies, might serve him without fear, <sup>75</sup>in holiness and righteousness before him all our days.

<sup>76</sup>And you, child, will be called the prophet of the Most High; for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways,

<sup>77</sup>to give knowledge of salvation to his people

by the forgiveness of their sins.

<sup>78</sup>By the tender mercy of our God,

the dawn from on high will break upon us,

<sup>79</sup>to give light to those who sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace."
