

# SECOND READING: 2 Corinthians 4:5-12

<sup>5</sup>We do not proclaim ourselves; we proclaim Jesus Christ as Lord and ourselves as your slaves for Jesus' sake. <sup>6</sup>For it is the God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

<sup>7</sup>But we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us. <sup>8</sup>We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed; perplexed, but not driven to despair; <sup>9</sup>persecuted, but not forsaken; struck down, but not destroyed; <sup>10</sup>always carrying in the body the death of Jesus, so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies. <sup>11</sup>For while we live, we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake, so that the life of Jesus may be made visible in our mortal flesh. <sup>12</sup>So death is at work in us, but life in you.

### GOSPEL: Mark 2:23-3:6

<sup>23</sup>One sabbath [Jesus] was going through the grainfields; and as they made their way his disciples began to pluck heads of grain. <sup>24</sup>The Pharisees said to him, "Look, why are they doing what is not lawful on the sabbath?" <sup>25</sup>And he said to them, "Have you never read what David did when he and his companions were hungry and in need of food? <sup>26</sup>He entered the house of God, when Abiathar was high priest, and ate the bread of the Presence, which it is not lawful for any but the priests to eat, and he gave some to his companions." <sup>27</sup>Then he said to them, "The sabbath was made for humankind, and not humankind for the sabbath; <sup>28</sup>so the Son of Man is lord even of the sabbath."

<sup>3:1</sup>Again he entered the synagogue, and a man was there who had a withered hand. <sup>2</sup>They watched him to see whether he would cure him on the sabbath, so that they might accuse him. <sup>3</sup>And he said to the man who had the withered hand, "Come forward." <sup>4</sup>Then he said to them, "Is it lawful to do good or to do harm on the sabbath, to save life or to kill?" But they were silent. <sup>5</sup>He looked around at them with anger; he was grieved at their hardness of heart and said to the man, "Stretch out your hand." He stretched it out, and his hand was restored. <sup>6</sup>The Pharisees went out and immediately conspired with the Herodians against him, how to destroy him.

## Written in consultation with Bishop Brenda Bos and in fond remembrance of Pastor Zachary Johnson

— Composer's Note —

**O**NE SUNDAY in the summer of 2023 Pastor Zach Johnson suggested that I compose a liturgy. I had not thought about this before but the idea soon took root and I felt I might be able to bring something new to our liturgical worship, both musically and lyrically—I especially wished to focus on our life together as the body of Christ and our calling to work for peace and justice in the world. I emailed Bishop Brenda Bos to ask if she had any ideas about this, and she certainly did: in a virtual meeting at the end of August she and I agreed that I would compose a liturgy for the Pentecost season inspired by the 2" chapter of Acts. I immediately phoned Pastor Zach to share the news and was expecting to collaborate with him to flesh out the themes and text of the liturgy. That turned out to be the last conversation I had with Zachary Johnson who was called to his eternal home the very next day.

Zach was our pandemic pastor, coming to us from Iowa with his wife Kristin and their two young daughters in February 2020, just a few weeks before the lockdown that would physically separate him from his new flock. In addition to the problems of preaching and pastoring at a distance, he also faced serious health challenges in the last few years. Even with all these difficulties our congregation was uniquely blessed by Pastor Zach's ministry to us, and with his love of music he was particularly encouraging to me as a songwriter. He helped to facilitate my participation in an artist residency program with Fuller Seminary, culminating in a hymn festival featuring several of my scripture songs which our church held in 2022.

In our shared grief at the loss of a beloved pastor and friend, Bishop Brenda and I were determined that the creative seed he planted would be brought to fruition in his honor, and she made time in her busy schedule to help me explore the aspects of the Pentecost story that we wanted to highlight in this liturgy. I was struck by how the Spirit enabled the disciples to both transcend their differences and celebrate their diversity: we see this in the way that the gospel of Christ is proclaimed in many languages, and also in the shared life of sacrificial love exhibited by the early church. Inspired by these reflections I wrote a six-piece liturgy called *Pentecost Peace* featuring three pieces with original lyrics: *Sacred Spate, Tapestry of Peace*, and the sending song *Be the Good News*.

Some of my favorite verses of scripture come from the end of Acts Chapter 2, so I pray that my words and music might evoke a vision of true community, nourished by God's unrelenting love, to sustain our hope in Christ and our faith in each other, even in our unjust and unpeaceful world.
